Br Baby don't you know I love you so? Can't you feel it when we touch? I will never never let you go, I love you oh so much.

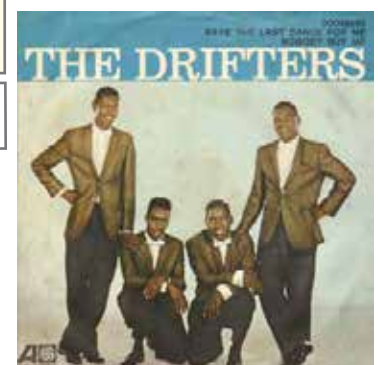
3 You can dance, go and carry on till the night is gone and it's time to go; If he asks if you're all alone can he take you home, you must tell him no.
